

The Marion Monroe MURPHY Family:

Juditha HOLCOMB was born 9, Sept, 1886, the tenth of eleven children born to Paschal and Elizabeth (KYLE) HOLCOMB. She had raven black hair, sky blue eyes and clear fair skin. She was a winsome lass standing a full five feet in height. Juditha grew up in the town of Clay, Clay Co W.VA., attending school there through the elementary grades. She then began working as a "hired girl" in the homes of the more affluent families. The skills she learned from these women were to stand her in good stead in later years. Juditha spent a great deal of time in the home of one of her teachers, Benjamin F. and Emma (Friend) MURPHY'S. and developed close friendships with his sisters, Glendora and Virginia. It was through this association that she met Marion Monroe MURPHY, brother of Ben and the girls, and whom she married 9, Sept, 1906.

Marion Monroe MURPHY was born 21, Oct, 1880, the fourth child of twelve born to Henry H. and Sarah Jane (DAWSON) MURPHY, Ivydale, Clay Co. W.VA. He was a tall, handsome, black haired, blue eyed Irishman, who was also a teacher in the Clay Co. School system. Following their marriage, Juditha and Marion moved to the MURPHY farm where Marion assisted his father in farming and continued to teach school.

In 1910, the little family, now numbering four, with the birth of Philip Henry MURPHY on 2, Apr, 1907, and Constance Elizabeth, born prematurely 5, Apr, 1909; left W.VA. for the Eastern plains of Colorado. They were accompanied by Marion's first cousins, Calvin Beecher and Princie DAWSON. They were in Seibert three months, and are shown there in Kit Carson Co. CO. in the April 26, 1910 census. The first of July, they moved to their adjoining homesteads at Karval in Lincoln Co, CO. With his cousins only one mile away from Juditha and the children and clearly visible with only grassland, cactus and yucca between, Marion took a job as Foreman on a sheep ranch 30 miles away. He made a flagpole in the yard so that a large white flag could be hoisted when Juditha needed help from the DAWSONS. Three weeks after they settled into their 12x12 foot "tar paper shanty", the white flag summoned Beecher because Constance had spiked a high fever and become unconscious. Beecher brought the nearest neighbor woman from five miles away, and then went after the Doctor some forty miles away. When the men arrived, they found the baby had died despite all efforts by the women, following an illness of less than 24 hours. The Doctor thought it was meningitis.

The MURPHY homestead was surrounded by a colony of bachelors "proving" up their places. Juditha baked bread and washed clothes for these men and they in turn hauled water from the one community well and brought food staples from town for her. In the fall of 1910, Juditha and Philip returned to W.VA. to await the birth of her third child, and Marion remained on the homestead.

Marion Maxwell MURPHY was born 29, Nov, 1910 @ Lizemores, W.VA. in the home of his Aunt Kisiah (HOLCOMB) and Uncle John RODGERS. Philip had been badly burned by boiling water the day before Max was born and they had to wait until he recovered to return to CO. in April of 1911.

The MURPHYS provided land and built the first community building on the northwest corner of their land. It served as school, Church, and place for community gatherings. Marion had a good baritone voice and organized singing groups.

As the neighbor men married and started raising families, Juditha became the local mid-wife and delivered most of the babies in the area. She never lost a mother or a baby.

The Marion Monroe MURPHY Family (Continued)

Juditha taught the newcomers how to adjust their recipes to prevent baking failures in the high altitude, things she had to learn by trial and error. She was well known for her ability as a good cook.

In 1917, Juditha and the boys returned to W.VA. for a visit, it was the last time they saw their Grandfather HOLCOMB, for Paschal died in 1920.

On 8, Oct, 1922, the family lifestyle was disrupted with the arrival of Nancy Jane MURPHY in Limon, Lincoln Co. CO., forty miles from the homestead. Max had accompanied his mother to the maternity home to await the birth, and much of the care of the new baby became his duty, from that day on.

When Philip entered Hi-School, he boarded in town at Hügo, forty miles away, the first two years; then Juditha rented a home in Hügo so that both boys could attend school there. By this time the family had bought a Model T Ford, so transportation was faster and they would return to the homestead Friday night. The weekend was spent washing, ironing, and preparing as much food as possible to last Marion for the following week. It was a grueling routine, but they were determined to educate the boys.

Following Philip's graduation, the family rented the farm and returned to Clay, W.VA. so that Juditha could help care for her Mother, Elizabeth HOLCOMB, who was ill with cancer. "Aunt Betsy", as she was known to most, was highly favored by her son-in-law, Marion. He always said that if ever a Saint walked this earth, she surely was such. She was a tiny person, with Auburn hair only slightly touched with grey in her 83rd year, her brown eyes still sparkly, her freckles unfaded. She was soft spoken and never complained. She lived with the MURPHY family from Jun, 1927 until shortly before her death 25, Aug, 1928, 17 days before her 84th birthday. She died at her daughter Kisiah (HOLCOMB) RODGER'S home, at Lizemores, Clay Co, W.VA.

Marion and Philip were employed at "MURPHY & CO, Dep't Store" in Clay, and Max at his Uncle E.G.'s MURPHY'S Grocery at the other end of town. Nancy attended her first three years of school in Clay, and Max attended Hi-School.

In April of 1930, the family returned to the homestead. Following 6 years of drought complicated by a depression, the boys returned to W.VA to seek employment, and Marion, unable to run the place alone, because Max had always run the machinery; held a farm sale and moved into town. Philip worked for Standard oil on a tanker for a year but tired of that and returned to the homestead in March of 1938 to raise turkeys. The 18th of April he trimmed all the trees in the orchard and made a huge bon-fire of the limbs. His mother went to check on his progress and found him lying in the fire, dead of a massive coronary at the age of 31. He had never married. He was exceptionally intelligent, personable and popular in the community. He suffered epileptic seizures from a brain injury at the age of two. While quite well controlled with medication, he was fearful of raising a family.

Marion carried a Star Mail Route from 1938 to his death in 1947. His route was a 78 mile round trip from Hugo to Karval to Hugo. He purchased supplies and delivered them as well as the mail to his patrons. He was honest and trustworthy and did the banking and other business transactions for Karval Businesses in Hugo. The MURPHYS were active in the Methodist Church in which he was an Elder.

The Marion Monroe MURPHY Family (Continued)

Following Marion's death , Juditha sold the homestead and her house in Hugo in 1948. She moved to Denver to live with her daughter, Nancy Jane and Eugene JENSEN. In 1950 they bought homes four blocks apart in the Aurora suburb of Denver.

In August of 1952, Juditha married Frank WOOD. The marriage ended in divorce in 1956 and she had her name restored as "Judith MURPHY". She died of a ruptured Aortic aneurysm 7, Mar, 1972, at age 85. She was buried in the Evergreen Cemetery at Hugo, CO. beside Marion, Philip and Constance.

The Family of Marion Maxwell (Max) MURPHY

In January of 1937, Max returned to W.VA and became employed by the International Harvester Company as a truck Mechanic. While visiting his Uncle and Aunt, Oscar and Bertha MURPHY in Cabin Creek, he was introduced to Vaultie Mae RHOADES who became his wife 6, Oct., 1938, in Boyd Co. Ky. @ Catlettsburg. Vaultie was born in Chelyan, Kanawa Co. W.VA. 1912.

Judith Ann, their first child was born 18, April, 1943, in Charleston, W.VA., but their residence there was interrupted by the war, and in 1944 Max was inducted into the Army. He served with the 1021 Eng. Twdy, Bridge Co. in the E.T.O. from 1944 to 1946. He spent some time in Army hospital having shrapnel removed from his knee and other reparative surgeries before his mustering out in 1946. Vaultie and Judith Ann lived with Max's parents in Hugo part of the time he was in service. Judith Ann became the "Apple" of Grandpa Marion's eye. Following his return from service, Max and his family went back to Charleston.

Marion Edward MURPHY arrived 13, May, 1947 and Grandpa MURPHY nearly burst with pride over his grandson namesake.

Janet Louise MURPHY joined the family on 24, June, 1949, welcomed by her Great-Aunt Dora (MURPHY) Walker who kept the Colorado relatives posted on news of the group.

In 1955 the serious illness of his mother, Juditha, caused the family to make an emergency visit and they decided to move to Aurora to help care for his mother. Max found employment with the Martin-Marietta Company. He was now a Journeyman Welder with the building trades. In Sept. of 1956 Max left the family settled near his mother and sister and worked in Minn. January of 1958 the family moved to Canton, Ohio, and have remained in the area.

In 1960 Max was seriously injured in a ditch cave-in where he was welding pipe and still has difficulties with his left leg as a result. 1961 was his last job any great distance from home when he was head welder on the Mountain Home, Idaho Missile Project. He returned to the Canton area, the spring of 1962.

Judith Ann MURPHY married Duane DOUGLAS May, 1962 in Canton, Ohio. Their daughter, Lori Ann DOUGLAS arrived a year later on 26, June, 1963. She was a reddish haired, blue eyed beauty. On 4, Nov, 1966 she was joined by her brother, Douglas. These were the only two children born to Judith Ann as this marriage ended in Divorce. Judith Ann married Robert SCHLOTT 2nd, and there are no children to this marriage.

The Family of Marion Maxwell (Max) MURPHY

The Family of his oldest child, Judith Ann MURPHY, DOUGLAS, SCHLOTT

Judith Ann's daughter, Lori Ann DOUGLAS married June, 1982, Jeff HANZIE, in Canton, Ohio. Their home was blessed with the birth of Ashley Ruth, on 6, April, 1983.

Douglas DOUGLAS is still at home with his mother and stepfather attending Hi-School. The family are Jehovah Witnesses.

Marion Edward, 2nd child of Max and Vaultie, served in the U.S. Marines in the Viet-Nam War. He returned home in 1968 and was married to Rebecca PRENIX 2, Mar, 1968 at Canton, Ohio. This marriage ended in divorce and there was no issue.

Marion Edward MURPHY married 2nd, Carol GREENE in Canton, Ohio, 1976. On 4, Aug, 1977, Constance Elizabeth MURPHY 11 (Named for her deceased Aunt) was born. This marriage also ended in divorce.

Ed is presently attending the Police Academy, and living at Malvern, Ohio with his parents.

Janet Louise MURPHY was married 11, April, 1981, at Eureka, Greenwood Co, Kansas, to Cecil GROSS, also a Veteran of the Viet-Nam conflict. They reside in Climax, Ks.

Celia Louise GROSS was born 29, Aug, 1982, @ Augusta, Butler Co., Ks. in the home of her Grandparents, Edward and Gladys GROSS. She was delivered by a mid-wife. Her Aunt Nancy and Uncle Gene JENSEN had the privilege of visiting her when she was just two weeks old and taking photos of her and her family back to her Grandparent MURPHYS and the Ohio relatives.

The Family of Eugene J. JENSEN and Nancy Jane MURPHY JENSEN
(4th child of Marion Monroe MURPHY and Juditha HOLCOMB MURPHY)

Nancy entered the third grade @ Pride of the Prairie School near the homestead the fall of 1930 and attended there through the fifth grade. June of 1933, She and her mother went to Akron Ohio for a visit with her Mother's sister, Nora HOLCOMB SMITH, to see if the lower altitude would lower Juditha's blood pressure. Nancy entered the 6th grade in Akron in a school with 2000 students. This was quite a change from a one room school with 20 students all in different grades. Each class was held in a different room, and Art, Music and Dance were all new fields for the "Cowgirl" from the plains. Juditha and Nancy returned to CO. in time for the 2nd semester of school, and that little country school looked mighty good. Nancy attended there the next year in the 7th grade and attended Karval part of the eighth grade and the first semester of the 9th grade. The last three and one-half years she was in Hi-School in Hugo.

Nancy was graduated from Hi-School in May, 1940 in Hugo. Among her classmates was the one who was to be come her husband. She had been accepted into the September class of students of St. Joseph School of Nursing in Denver, CO., when her Fiance received notice from the Draft Board that he would be in the next group of Inductees. Nancy Jane MURPHY and Eugene Jens JENSEN were married 2, Aug, 1941 in Raton, Colfax Co. N.M. They did not announce their marriage because Nursing Students could not marry at that time.

Eugene Jens JENSEN was the first of thirteen children born to Jens Peter JENSEN and Viola RASMUSSEN JENSEN. He was born on a cattle ranch at Clifford, CO., 15, Mar, 1922. His family lived in Lincoln Co, CO, following his parents marriage in Ne., 2, Mar. 1921. Gene was educated in country schools until he entered Hugo Hi-School as a freshman. He was a good student who was voted Outstanding Boy of his Senior Class. He tried to enlist and was rejected, only to be inducted two years later. It was his good fortune to be placed in the Army Air Corps which was his choice. He spent the winter of 1942 at Lincoln Ne., and was sent to Aircraft Engine School in Detroit Michigan the spring of 1943. He then served at Mitchell Field N.Y. where his father had been in 1917. He next was sent to Westover Field in Mass., and in June 1943, was sent to P-47 School in Farmington, L.I. N.Y.

Nancy had just been dismissed from school after the authorities were informed that she was married, so she went to visit her husband in L.I. because he was scheduled to be shipped overseas after the P-47 School. Gene was sent back to Westover, but his blood pressure was elevated and his tonsils badly infected, so he was hospitalized and not shipped overseas with his unit. He was sent to Bluthenthal Field @ Wilmington. N.C.. Meanwhile, Nancy had been accepted in the Seton Nursing School as a transfer student, so while "Gene" served between Wilmington and Goldsboro @ Seymour Johnson Field, Nancy was a Cadet Nurse out of Fort Carson, in Colorado Springs, CO. The end of the war brought Nancy's release from the corps instead of being sent to the South Pacific as the young couple feared. Nancy wrote her State Board Nursing Examination Oct, 1945 and Gene came home on leave on her last day in school.

After four years of being separated except for short periods of Army Leave, the couple loaded their 1935 Dodge and headed for N.C. Their stay there was only six weeks long, as Gene was mustered out 15, Dec. 1945. They were home in time for Christmas. Gene worked in a local garage and the couple lived with Nancy's parents in Hugo because there was no available housing.

The Family of Eugene Jens JENSEN and Nancy Jane MURPHY JENSEN
(4th child of Marion Monroe MURPHY and Juditha HOLCOMB MURPHY)

Karen Anne JENSEN was born 25, July, 1946.at the Hospital in Colo. Spgs. CO., where her mother had graduated. When she was eight months old, her father was employed by Continental Airlines in Denver and the family moved to Aurora, CO. Gene bought a small house trailer and rented space near Fitzsimons. This was their home until Dec, 1947.

Nancy's father's death 5,Nov,1947, brought more changes. Her mother sold her home in Hugo and bought a home in Denver so they could all live together. Nancy went to work at St. Luke's Hospital in Denver in 1948, then quit and ran a foster-home.

In 1950 the large house was sold and two small homes four blocks apart were purchased in Aurora, close to the airport. When Karen entered school Nancy again went to work for St. Lukes Hospital as staff nurse. She was there until 27, Aug, 1976 when she retired from the position of Associate Director of Nursing. She is co-chairman of the N P. & P.T. Nurses Assoc. Gene worked for Continental Airlines as an Aircraft Mechanic for 35 yrs. retiring 1, Aug, 1982. He is now active in their Retirees Group. The family has always loved the out of doors and have been campers, trailerists and now spend much time in their motor home. Gene enjoys golf and both are avid fishermen.

Nancy is now very much involved in Genealogical pursuits, and both she and Gene are members of the Aurora Genealogical Society, for which she is the Genealogist. She is an active member of Park Hill U. Methodist Ch. Karen is their only child.

The Family of Ronald Lewis KENNEDY and Karen Anne JENSEN KENNEDY.

Karen attended schools in the Aurora area, graduating from Central Hi-School in 1964. She entered the School Of Physical Therapy at Colorado University in Boulder, CO., 1964. At Park Hill U. Methodist Church, Denver, On 11, June, 1966 she was united in marriage to Ronald Lewis KENNEDY, her sweetheart since Hi-School. Ron was in The School of Pharmacy at C.U. They both continued their studies and graduated in 1968.

Karen was employed at St. Luke's Hospital and Valley View Hospitals until the birth of their first child. They lived in Northglen, CO. Timothy Lewis KENNEDY was born 2, May, 1972 at St Luke's Hospital, Denver, CO. The first Grandchild of either family, he received more than his share of attention. Karen returned to work part-time.

Tara Michele KENNEDY was born 29, July, 1973, and Karen was now fully occupied at home for awhile, but returned to St. Luke's part-time that year. They had moved to Englewood 6 weeks before Tara's birth, but she was born at St. Luke's.

The family is very active in the Shepherd of the Hills, Lutheran Church. Karen has assisted in Sunday School activities, clerical work and the Women's group for years. She converted to the Lutheran Faith from the Methodist following her marriage. Her father and most of his family are Lutheran.

Karen continues to work part-time at St. Luke's and teaches Aerobic Dance under the Jackie Sorensen group. Capable and enthusiastic, she is also Girl Scout Leader for Tara's Troop.

Ronald Lewis KENNEDY was born 9, Aug, 1946 to Lewis Walter KENNEDY and Eilene BAIRD KENNEDY in Glockner-Penrose Hospital in Colorado Springs, CO. His father was in the Air Corps at that time. Ron is the older of two children. Ron was raised in the Denver- Aurora area, attending the same schools as Karen. He graduated from Central in 1963. He is industrious, and now owns two Pharmacies between which he divides his work week. He is assistant coach for Tim's soccer team.

Both children are active in Scouting and in sports. Soccer seems to be the favorite. Timothy thinks red hair and freckles should not happen to any boy, especially curly hair. Tara's blonde hair is now reddish. She is petite and in many ways much like her great-grandmother, Juditha. Both ch. have grey-green eyes. Tara is studying piano and Tim plays drums. They spend a great deal of time with both sets of Grandparents, and get to see their Great-Grandmother JENSEN, who is still living in Hugo, CO., quite often.

Dear Patrick Murphy descendant,

I just returned from a quick dash to West Virginia to see Lewisburg in Greenbrier County. Patrick's first 329-acre farm was nearby, but we didn't even have time to look up the Huggart Creek area. We stopped to see the Old Stone Presbyterian Church where Patrick could have been married had he been a Presbyterian. Many neighbors/friends of his belonged to that church. We also went to Braxton County to see the second farm between Strange Creek and the Birch River.

Thought you might be interested in this bio of James G. Murphy, Patrick's son. It gives tangible details that enlighten us about life on the Elk River. Also included a couple of maps that help with understanding James's route to McHenry County, Illinois.

I love "small history," so have made some observations based on this account:

1. James G. Murphy's birthdate of 8/15/1800 in Braxton County puts Patrick on the second farm by that time, so we know he probably left Greenbrier before that time.
2. Patrick is described as a "hunter and farmer."
3. Establishes Charleston, W. Va. as THE place where the family did business. The article has a couple of minor mistakes. Charleston, which was hardly more than a fort then, is only about 50 miles from Strange Creek, not 80. And they would have been floating oak staves down the Elk River to the Kanawha, as the Elk runs across the edge of their farm.
4. Their medicines were "forest remedies" and whisky.
5. Neighbors had a still for making whisky.
6. They considered themselves religious, honest, and hospitable.
7. They had a fireside in the cabin. Just like the pictures of pioneers in history books!
8. James G. Murphy had a log cabin house in Braxton County, so maybe brother John and father Patrick also had log cabin houses.
9. James journeyed to Illinois in 1845 (7 years after his nephew Andrew arrived) by way of flat boat to Charleston, steamboat to Alton, Illinois, ? to LaSalle, Illinois, and ox team from LaSalle to McHenry County. Unlike Andrew, James floated to Illinois, then somehow paddled almost to Chicago!

THE MURPHY FAMILY

Our family began with Immigrant, Patrick MURPHY, born County Cork, Ireland about 1750. Family legend is he became a sailor age twelve, came into United States; age fourteen. He is most likely the Patrick MURPHY listed in Cap't DOBLE'S passenger list , 1763, arriving from Newfoundland in December at Boston Harbor.

Patrick served in French and Indian Wars, listed in Cherokee Expedition. Enlisting 16, Aug, 1776, he was in the First Company in VA. MD. Regiment. He enlisted 7, Jan, 1777 for duration of Revolutionary War, seven years service. He was wounded in Georgia, served at Point Pleasant and signed Petition to re-establish Fort Randolph, 19, Sep, 1781. (Site of Point Pleasant)

Patrick married three times. First to Miss KERNEY, 1772. He served with John KERNEY, Berkeley co, VA, 1776. One son, David, was born Botetourt co, VA, 9, Mar, 1773. We know no other children, nor how long the marriage lasted.

David married Jane HUGGART 4, Nov, 1808. 1820 Nicholas VA. census- 1 male each-10-16 16-26 (?) 26-45. Female 1 ea. 0-10 10-16? 26-45. Son, William H. MURPHY, born 25, Nov, 1808, (12 yrs) Susan born 1820. 1830 census, Nicholas lists a 15-20 male? one 20-30 (William H) girl 0-5 ? and 10-15 (Susan) .(Four unknown people.) 1840 Braxton co, VA census shows David (60-70) with William H. Murphy, age 30-40. Wm. had married Susan FRIEND 1833. She died 1846. Known children: Sabathial, Mary Jane, Aquilla, Almeda, all born VA.

William H. MURPHY moved to Center, McHenry co, IL where we find Wm. 42, 1850; with the children above and Luciba, 39, born NY, Susan 3, born IL. , Delighi 2/12 born IL. David 77, b: VA Wm.H. married Luciba Button, 1853. 1860 census shows them in Dorr, IL. without Delighi, but plus Francis, Edward, Charles and David, 86. David lived to be 96. He is buried in McHenry co, IL.

2nd child of John J. MURPHY: Andrew Wilson MURPHY, b: 3, Apr, 1816, married 10, Oct, 1839, Lewis co, VA,, Caroline Matilda SQUIRES. They settled at Greenwood, McHenry co, IL., with brother Owen where both families were prominent. Children: John, Elijah, Norton, Asa, Robert, Perry, Charles, Mary, Caroline and Etta. Caroline married 19, Jun, 1860, August VOGEL. Their daughter, Mary Caroline VOGEL married Homer E. SWITZER and I correspond with their daughter, Vivian SWITZER BASSETT; b 18, Oct, 1908, Streator, IL. She married Lisle E. BASSETT . Vivian has been exceptionally helpful in researching this family history. She lives in McHenry, IL. Her son, Homer, lives here in Aurora, CO and her daughter in Germany. Vivian is DAR Registrar for Kishwaukee Chapter of Woodstock, IL. and is Past Regent.

John J's 3rd child, Felicity, b: 21, Nov, 1817, married William BAILES. She died 16, Aug, 1839.

#4- George W. became a Doctor, lived in Golden, CO, married Cornelia. He was b: 28, Aug, 1819.

#5- Robert b: 24, Aug, 182?, married three times, lived in CA.

#6- Jane Hugart MURPHY 8, Sep, 1823, married Charles DUFFIELD, 13, Apr, 1840; died 22, Sep, 1877. Jane died 5, Sep, 1890. Both buried DUFFIELD Cemetery, Braxton Co, WV.

#7 Nancy J, b: 17, Jan, 1826- died 23, Mar, 1846. Married Samuel CUTLIP.

#8 Fannie, b: 14, Oct, 1828, died: 15, Sep, 1829

#9 Melvina, b: 6, Nov, 1830, married Marshall JOHNSON

#10 Susan, b: 30, Jun, 1833, married Alexander ROSE 13, Dec, 1847, buried Oak Hill, Lawrence, KS.

#11 Elizabeth Ann b: 1, Aug, 1835, married ~~Christian~~ ^{George Washington Rose} LONG. She died 16, Feb, 1871.

Levisa b: ca 1818, married Philip MARION. William was living with them, 1850.

William Jr. b: Sep, 1819, married Cynthia LIVELY 19, Jan, 1848. Children: John A., William W., Robert, Margaret, Rachel, Warren B., Samuel, Henry F., Mary L., Residence, Strange Creek. He died at his son, William's 9, July, 1892.

David b: ca 1825 is believed to be son of William and Barbara. Lived next door to Rachel and Isaac DILLY 1860, in home of B. B. SARGEANT.

James F. b: July, 1829, Nicholas co,VA., youngest child.

William Sr. and Barbara separated between 1830 and 1840. We find him with one male, 15-20, who would be David, (1840 census Nicholas) and no females. Barbara is not listed separately, so she and James F. are with one of the daughters, probably. Land records have both their names before 1835, afterwards only his. From 1850, Barbara is with James F. and Elizabeth until her death, 1873.

James F. MURPHY, b: July, 1829, married 29, June, 1849, Gilmer co, VA., Elizabeth COOK PARSONS, widow of Joseph PARSONS; mother of George Washington PARSONS. They lived 1850, Kanawha co, two houses away from Elizabeth's parents, Barnabus and Christina McCUNE COOK. James F and Elizabeth are my Gr-Grandparents. Children:
