On this the 30<sup>th</sup> day of December 1863,

I personally appeared before me the Subscribed, a Justice of the Peace in & for the County aforesaid Mrs. Mary F. Pender, who, after being sworn according to Law, deposes and says, that she is the Widow of William D. Pender who was a Major General, in the Service of the Confederate States in the present War with the United States; that she saw William D. Pender <sup>or appointed</sup> be appointed as such on or about the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1863 and died on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of July 1863 at Staunton Virginia

in consequence of a wound received by him in the Battle of Gettysburg Pa. on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of the same month -

That she makes this deposition for the purpose of obtaining from the Government of the Confederate States whatever may have been due the said deceased at the time of his death, or other allowances for his Services as Major General of said Army.

Pender and to recommend him to you for promotion - Since under my command he has fought his Brigade, and uniformly with success, in the battles of Mechanicsville, Cold Harbor, Frasier Farm, Cedar Run, Manassas, ~~at Hill~~, Harper's Ferry, Shaffersburg, Shepherdstown and ~~Adamsburg~~ - He has been conspicuous for gallantry, skill, and promptness - Has been wounded three times, and never left the field, save for the time necessary to bandage his wounds and eminently deserves promotion

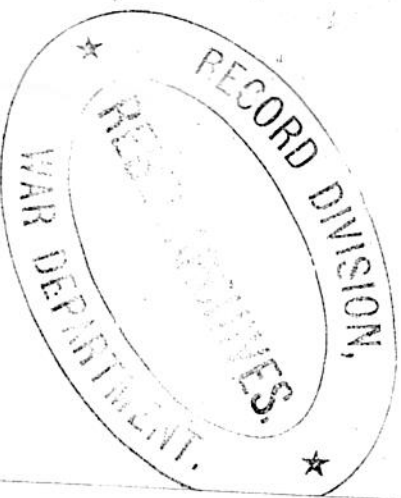

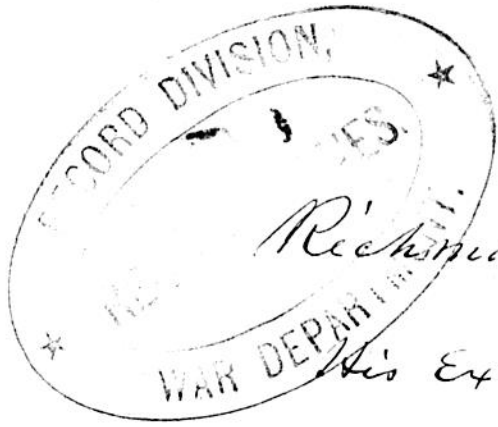

Richmond Feb. 16<sup>th</sup> 1863.

His Excellency  
Jefferson Davis.

Sir

The undersigned members of congress from North Carolina, having learned that Maj. Gen. D. H. Hill has been appointed to command in North Carolina, and that a Maj. General will be appointed to take command of the former division of Gen Hill in his absence, we most respectfully recommend to your favorable consideration Brig. Gen. W. D. Pender as a suitable officer to be promoted to the command of the former division of Maj. Gen. D. H. Hill.

We trust you will not consider this recommendation obtrusive, when you consider, that twenty two regiments and one battalion of Gen Jacksons corps are from North Carolina, comprising a much larger number of troops from that state than from any other in said corps; Permit us to add, what <sup>you</sup> already know, that Gen.

Pender is an accomplished officer, a christian,  
and a gentleman of the very first order.
